Dear Ladies and Gentlemen,

1. Further to my letter of 12-12-25 ([PJ no 0](#), EN [PJ no 0.2](#)) concerning the presentation of my proposal platform last year, the unconstitutionality of the legal aid law in France, my informal candidacy for the position of Secretary-General of the United Nations, as well as the war in Ukraine, I am writing to you again briefly (1) to transmit three documents related to my candidacy for the position of Secretary-General of the United Nations, and (2) to offer a few comments on these documents and on the clarifications I have provided regarding my proposals.

2. Please find enclosed a curriculum vitae ([PJ no 3](#), EN [PJ no 3.2](#)), a draft of my vision statement ([PJ no 1](#), EN [PJ no 1.2](#)), as well as the six proposals of my platform ([PJ no 2](#), EN [PJ no 2.2](#)), for which I have slightly revised the descriptions and clarified certain elements. These documents will help you assess my candidacy for the position of Secretary-General of the UN and, for some, perhaps consider the possibility of nominating me for this role. The vision statement highlights, among other things, the importance of (a) placing AI and the Internet at the core of the UN's action, (b) generating new and sufficient revenues to enable the UN to fulfill its mission more effectively, (c) creating two new international institutions, and (d) assuming new functions such as the governance of AI and the Internet, as well as the management of UN data centers.

3. With regard to the creation of a new agency for peacekeeping, disarmament, the modernization of armed forces, and the governance of military AI, the objective of the proposal was (and remains) to strengthen the UN's capacities in these areas, and not to modify the functioning of

the Security Council or the UN Secretariat (Office for Disarmament Affairs, Department of Peacekeeping Operations, etc.). I therefore propose the creation of a new agency — similar to the IAEA or the OPCW — which would be responsible, among other tasks and in addition to the governance of military AI, for collecting information that the UN and its related agencies do not currently collect, conducting studies in the fields of disarmament and peacekeeping that the UN cannot presently undertake, and carrying out “verifications” that are important for the Security Council and the UN, as the IAEA and the OPCW currently do.

4. The Office for Disarmament Affairs maintains a database on countries’ defense budgets and also collects other important information (notably on the use of AI in the military domain). UNIDIR likewise collects information and conducts studies to support the UN in the field of disarmament. However, the information available to the UN in the areas of peacekeeping and disarmament remains very limited. The UN does not, for example, possess any (detailed or even general, it seems) information on arms producers, on the composition of armed forces, or on weapons stockpiles in each country, even though such information is important — despite being difficult to obtain and requiring appropriate means for its preservation and regular updating.

5. It would be useful to have precise data on the impact of the arms industry (and even of certain types of weapons) on the climate, on the use of the planet’s resources, and on environmental degradation, among other aspects. Having information on the composition of armed forces and on weapons stockpiles in each country would also be very useful for developing the best possible strategies to encourage countries to reduce their defense budgets and their weapons stockpiles. The creation of the new organization for the governance of the Internet and AI (...) and the increased cooperation between countries in many areas that I propose should facilitate the acquisition of some of this information, its preservation, and the establishment of systems for regular updates.

6. The development of new technologies such as the Internet and AI, as well as the acquisition of advanced knowledge in various fields, imposes important responsibilities upon us. For example, if AI and the Internet make it possible to develop justice systems for the poorest that are less costly and more efficient, and to generate the revenues necessary to establish the infrastructures and skills required to operate these digital justice systems, and if we do nothing, then the systematic theft of the poor becomes an organized and transnational crime (and even a crime against humanity). It is this responsibility that led me to work on the proposals presented here, and which, I hope, will encourage you to act for the good of humanity.

7. I thank you in advance for the attention you will give to the enclosed documents and remain at your disposal to provide any additional information you may require. Please accept, Dear Ladies and Gentlemen, the expression of my highest consideration.
